



Georgetown Soccer Club – Eustace Collins Scholarship Application Rules & Regulations

The Georgetown Soccer Club is proud to award \$500 scholarships to one graduating student from Georgetown District High School and one graduating student from Christ the King Catholic Secondary School to support post-secondary education.

Scholarships will be awarded by the Georgetown Soccer Club to successful applicants who, for at least three years, have played with a Georgetown Soccer Club team and are currently participating in soccer in some capacity, this may be as a player, referee, coach or other volunteer position.

The qualifications of the recipients are as follows:

- i) Proceeding from Grade 12 or their fifth year of high school to a college, university or post-secondary institution in Canada or the U.S. approved by the Georgetown Soccer Club Scholarship Committee.
- ii) Must have demonstrated good community citizenship, personality and leadership.

Applicants must follow the scholarship application process in order to be considered for a Georgetown Soccer Club Scholarship. Georgetown Soccer Club reserves the right to forego processing any applications from applicants who do not follow the procedure outlined below.

The funds awarded will be held until the recipient provides proof of tuition payment for the first semester as verification of enrollment that he/she is attending the post-secondary institution approved by the Scholarship Committee.

A scholarship that is awarded, but not availed of within two years of the award winner's high school graduation year will be deemed to be null and void. The aforementioned scholarship award will be then awarded to a new candidate the following year.

Application Process

All scholarship applications must be submitted no later than May 31st of each year.

All applications must include a completed application form, a current transcript and proof of high school enrolment. Two letters of reference (from the school principal, vice principal, guidance counsellor, teacher, or soccer coach) can also be included to verify the candidate's character and community involvement. The Scholarship Committee will evaluate the applications based on the following criteria: Community Involvement (40% weight); Contributions and Involvement with the Georgetown Soccer Club (40%); Grades (20%).
